

THE BOTTOM LINE:

Summer Students. There are several government programs that provides wage assistance and funding for organizations to hire students. Here are just a few of them:

For Nova Scotia:

The Student Career Skills Development Program (SCSDP) partners with not-for-profit organizations to create career-related summer jobs for post-secondary students. The jobs will be distributed across the province based on population and unemployment for each county. Application must be post-marked 31 January.

The Strategic Cooperative Education Incentive provides private sector, government-funded and non-profit organizations 50 per cent of the required minimum hourly wage of \$15.00 an hour for cooperative education opportunities.

For New Brunswick:

The Student Employment Experience Development (SEED) Program provides a variety of employment opportunities for post-secondary students during the summer months. Jobs are approved at the provincial, municipal, and First Nations government levels and in non-profit organizations.

All of Canada:

Canada Summer Jobs is a Government of Canada initiative that provides funding to help employers create summer job opportunities for students. Application period is 1 February to 28 February.
